Monocoque

Instead of having fun at the Holiday Dinner, I was stuck in an Israeli bunker near the Lebanese border. OK, I was teaching a class there, though. On the way back I stopped in Munich to go to the best tech museum on earth. One item that caught my eye was the sports plane on the right. The 1934 Messerschmitt 108Bf, shown with it's younger brother the ME 109 behind it, was labeled as the first metal, full monocogue plane. The design proved to be superior to the spaceframe; greater strength and rigidity but less weight. By the end of WWII, all aircraft would be a variation of monocoque construction.

Actually, car production started using the monocoque principle at about the same time, starting as a French invention, and first used in mass production on the Citroen Traction Avant. The VW Beetle and the Austin Mini are other examples of early monocoque design, though the Mini used subframes for component hookup.

Then comes Lotus. Monocoque road cars? Chapman did one more daring, the Elite. Monocoque but in fiberglass, and everything conected to it. And for race cars? The Lotus 25 was the first F1 car to use a monocoque 'tub', and it sent a shockwave through





the racing establishment. The monocoque frame formed by bending thin aluminum plates made it possible to obtain rigidity and lighter weight at the same time, compared to the "Space Frame" construction with steel pipes which was commonly used until then. Why did it take so long for the monocoque design to get to racing construction? I believe it was cost. Initial cost for the tooling for monocoque, or 'unibody' as we call it

in the U.S., is high. Lotus was close to bankruptcy with the Elite R&D and manufacture, because not enough were sold to cover the high initial investment.

P.S.: It took me 4 hours by German train, Frankfurt to Munich, in perfect comfort. Meanwhile, my daughter was coming home on AMTRACK. Eugene Oregon to San Fran; 21 hours, 5 hours late. Are we really the greatest superpower? Our infrastructure sure isn't.



The Lotus Sport Exige GT3 Lotus Sport Exige GT3 testing for FIA GT3 European Championship

December 16, 2005

A prototype of the Lotus Sport Exige GT3 race car was unveiled at the annual FIA GT Championship presentation ceremony outside the world famous Casino in Monte Carlo, Monaco on 02 December, 2005. The following day (03 December 2005), the first test for the car took place at the high speed Paul Ricard High Tech Test Track in Southern France under FIA supervision, the first stage in the Lotus Sport Exige GT3 becoming eligible for FIA GT3 competition. This latest FIA series, which will start in 2006, is for race cars that have an equal power to weight, and that have a direct lineage to their road going versions.

Basic prototype specification

Like the standard Exige, the Lotus Sport Exige GT3 comes complete with the award-winning light weight bonded aluminium chassis. This is complemented by low weight 5-spoke forged alloy wheels, carbon body panels, and a revised high downforce aerodynamic package incorporating a race front splitter and adjustable carbon fibre rear wing. The Toy Rallye, previously called Toddler, has been presented annually since 1962. For many of these years, the Fremont Touring Club hosted the event with Harriet Gittings as rallyemaster. TRC took over the event with the provisions that the rallye retain its AB-multiple choice RI format and be run in the greater Fremont area on the first Sunday in December.

This was a challenge for Ken Schott, this year's rallyemaster, as it was his first time writing an AB rallye. Ken produced an outstanding event combining two-part, lettered route instructions with questions that could be answered with what was found along the route. Ken also included a holiday theme featuring reindeer, elves and a magical sleigh that transformed itself under the effects of toy trains,

dolls, soldiers, cars, and fire trucks. Contestants were encouraged to count candy canes and play reindeer games.

In addition to all those who showed up to run and donate toys, I'd like to thank the workers and cosponsors of this annual charity event. 


